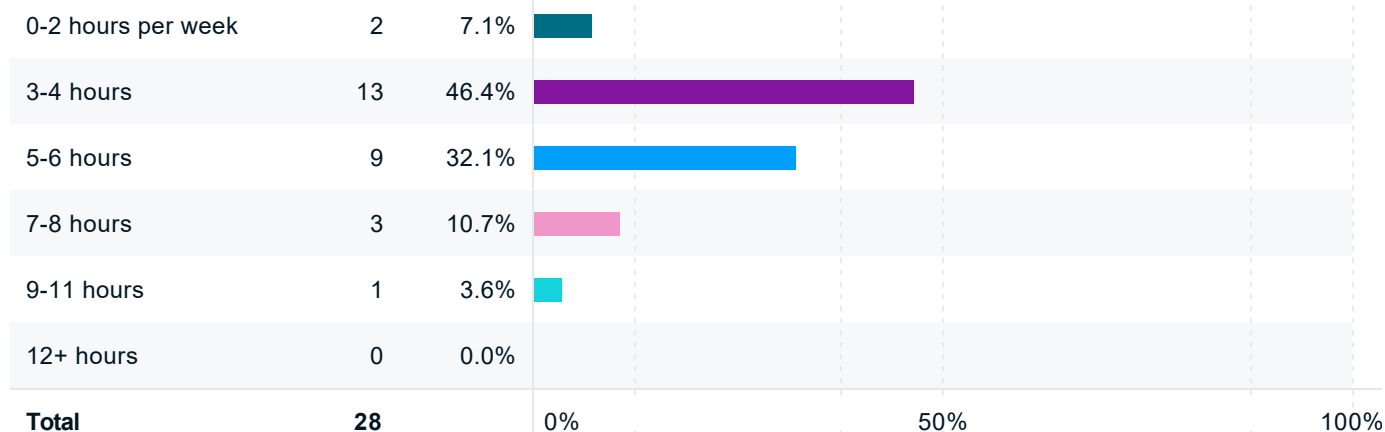


## Describe what else you did (or could have done) to contribute to a positive learning experience in this course.

I think explaining the course material to someone else would have been very beneficial to me.

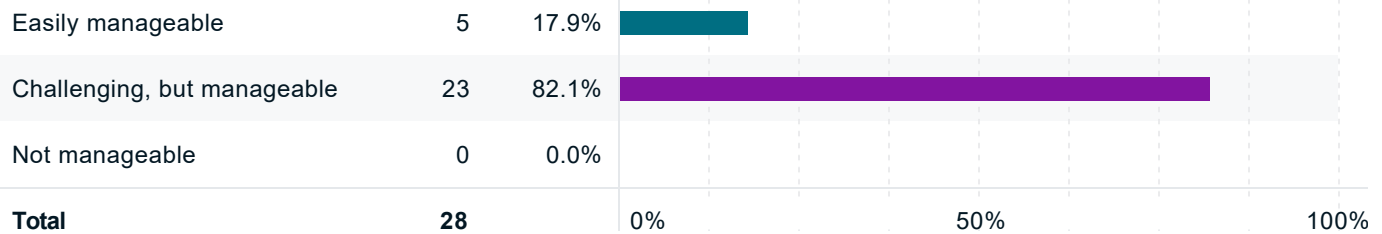

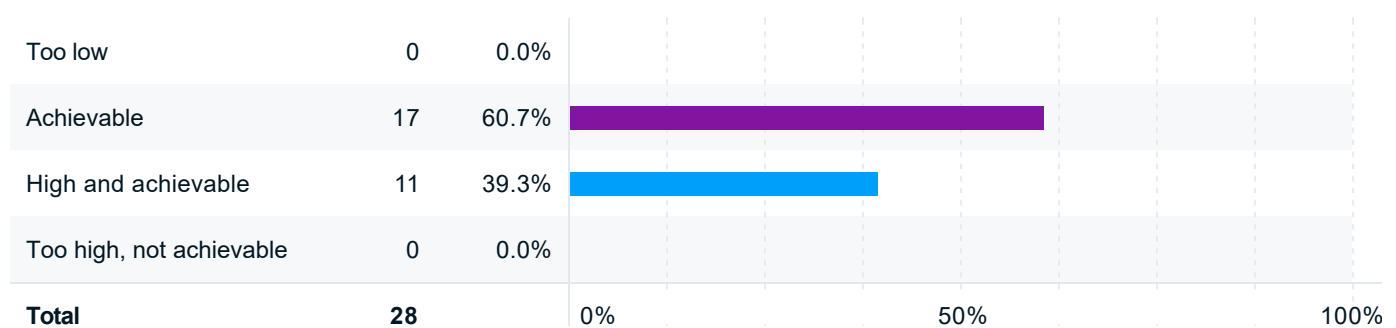
It's challenging but manageable when practicing and remembering the steps on how to complete Posit Cloud, Excel and Tableau assignments for homework. Just time consuming.

The professor helps out a lot, but some assignments are very difficult. They take many hours and cause a lot of frustration.

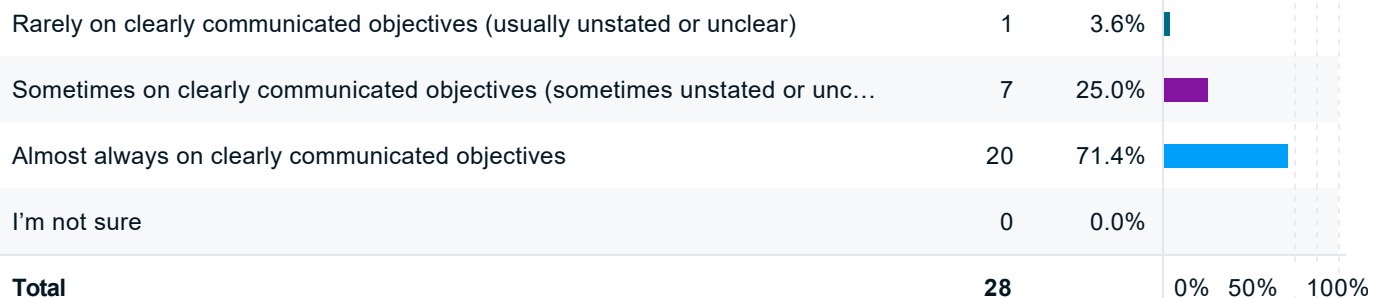
The content and course wasn't easy, it was a different course that I have never taken, but my professor made it achievable with her attitude towards us students and the encouragement she provided all semester long.

Objectives were communicated clearly. However, there were certain times I felt I had to search throughout canvas for a resource I was looking for. For example, the link to get into R studio was in a previous week, so when I needed to get access again to my projects it took a while for me to find where to open them.
Sometimes it was hard following all of the links and the links embedded in the links.
Sometimes communication in this class was lacking leaving students unsure when due dates were, what the expectations for assignments were, and how to facilitate group work when we were never explicitly told our groups. While communication did get better throughout the semester, it is something that should continue to be improved upon.

Sometimes I found myself very confused what to do with homework assignments on my own due to directions not feeling explained the best at times, but eventually was able to figure out what needed to do.
Very clear on what was expected and was very understanding with confusing projects or assignments.
Every assignment had clean instructions and or a clear rubric on how we were being graded.

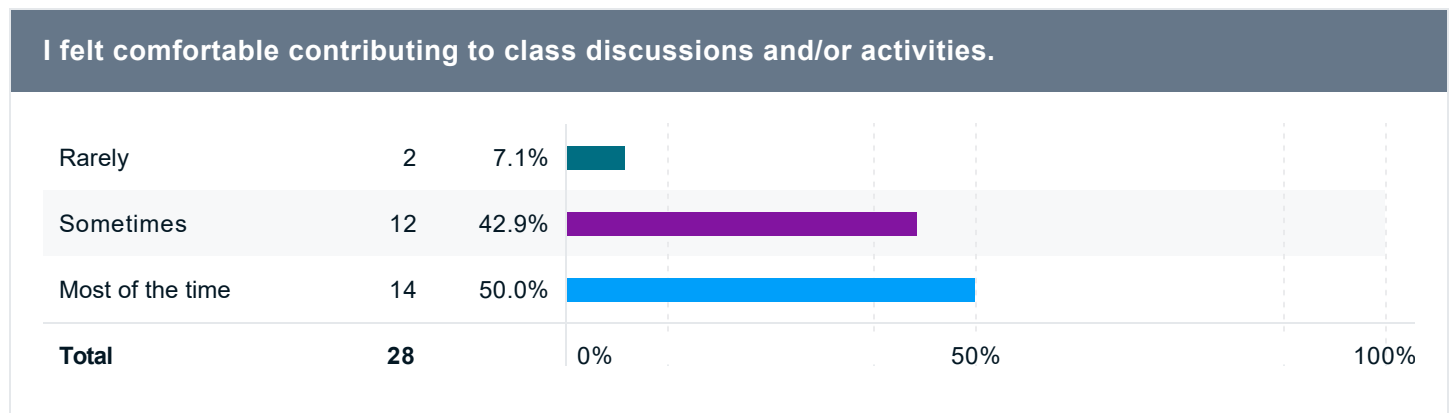

We had many group projects and many times to ask peers questions.

It was very important to communicate with groups members during the group projects and presentations.
Both of our group projects we were beneficial to my learning. Group problem solving sessions made it easier to compare approaches and learn from each other's reasoning.

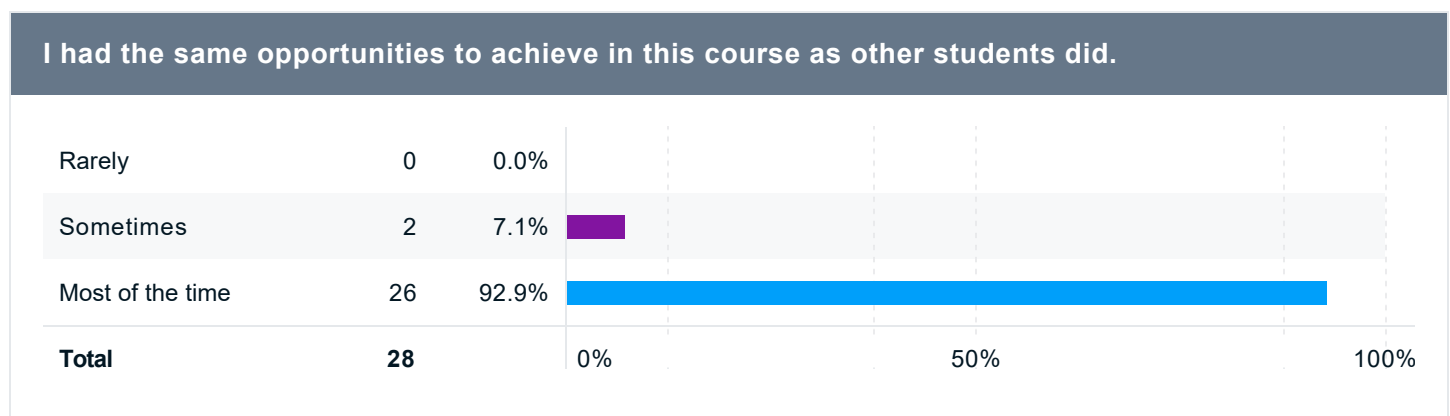

I don't ever feel comfortable contributing in class discussions nothing against anyone its just how I am.

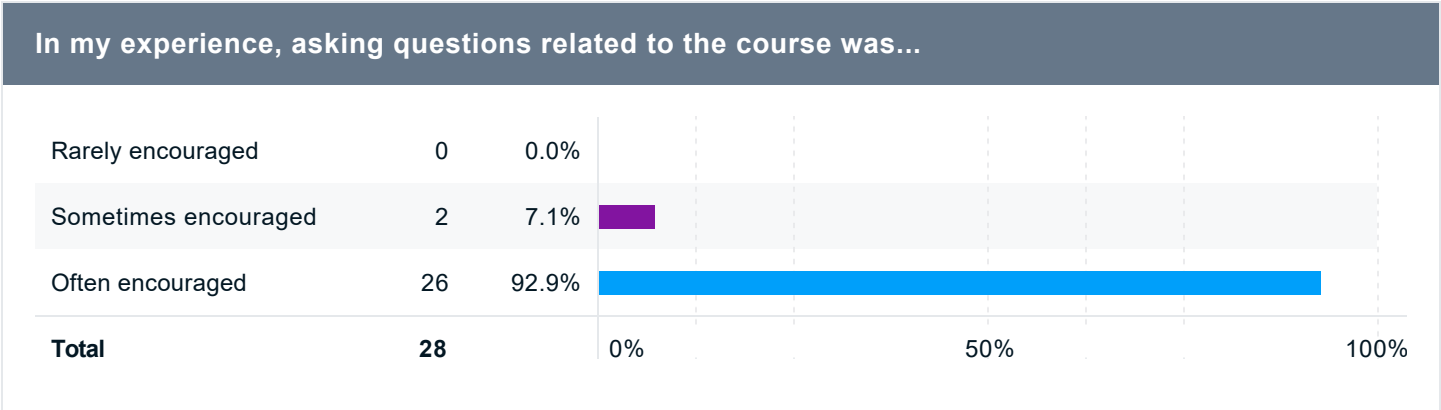
## Opportunities

There really isn't a chance to not get the same opportunity in this class as everyone else.

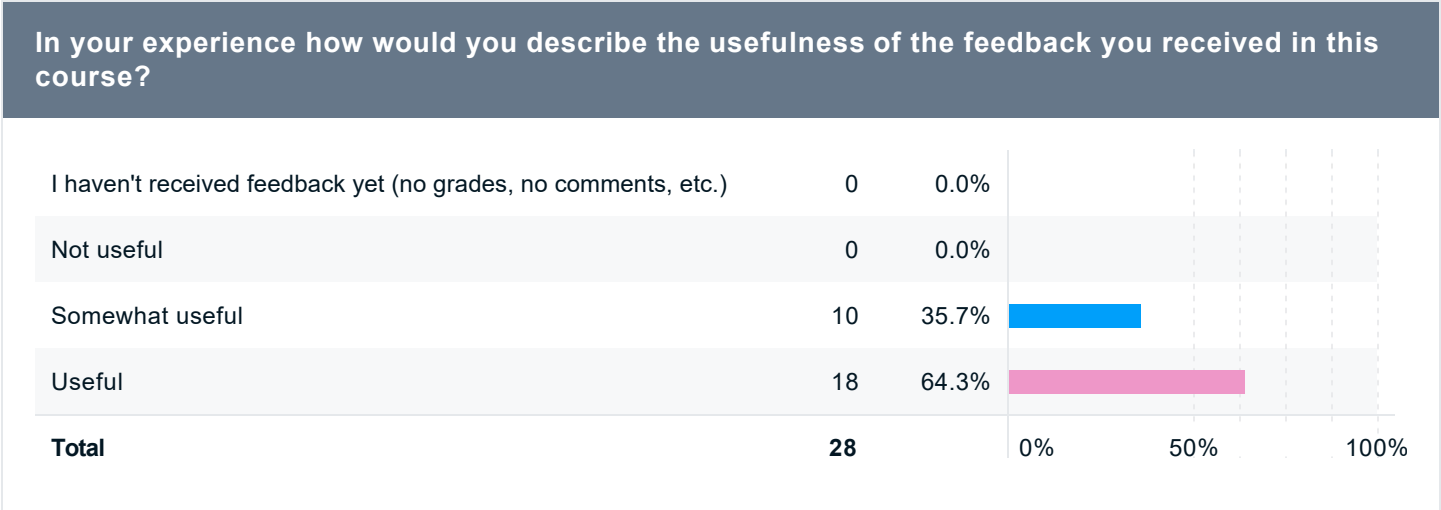
Support
