
Workload Manageability



Some of the short answer questions required very in–depth answers that I feel wouldn't be found by someone without an economics degree (we don't share the same line of thinking as the professor).


Sometimes questions felt like they lacked context. But I was unsure if it was just me not understanding it.

The professor did a great job of making kids feel welcome in answering questions, and never made students feel less if they got a question wrong. I just didn't answer much because I'm a little coward.


I felt I wasn't given enough time to think about in class questions properly so I wasn't able to participate

Randomly picking students to answer questions made me hesitant to come to class.




