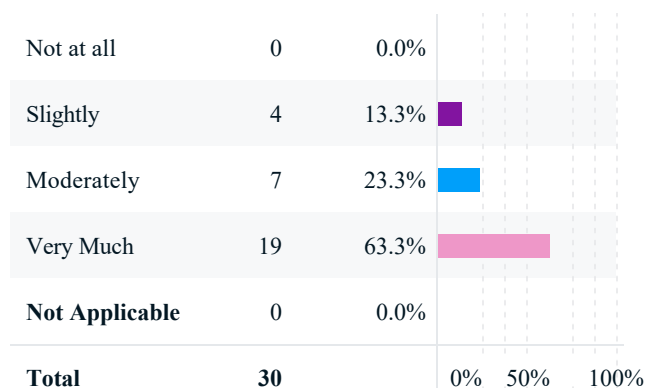

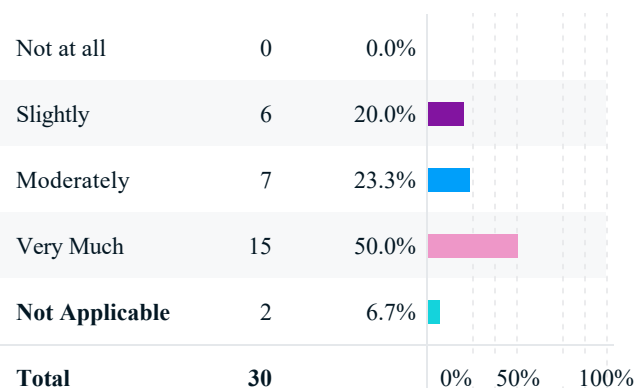

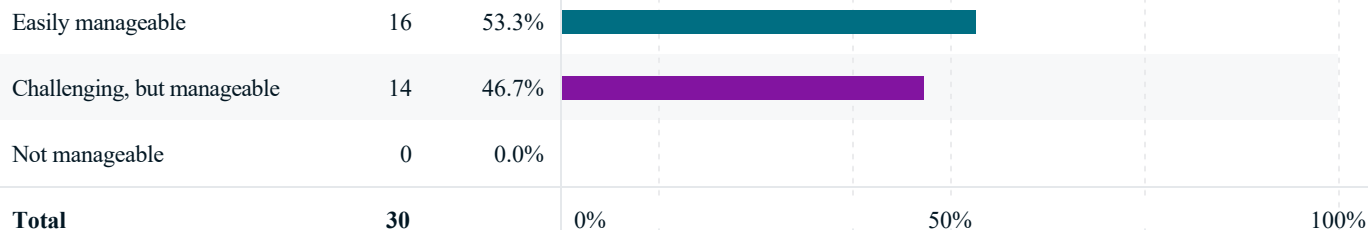

Not a lot of homework

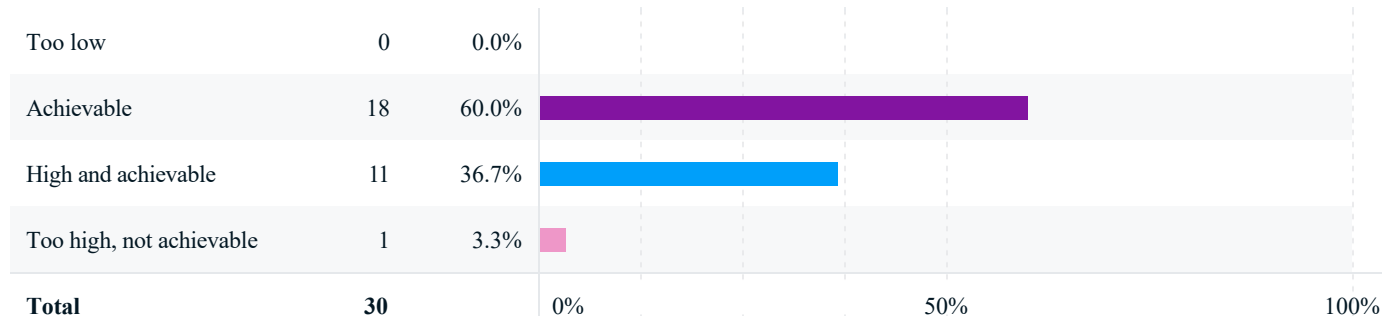
There was work but I got it done

Didn't expect much however I think as students we were approached the wrong way and discouraged when told to discuss and ask questions because we were afraid to be talked down to.

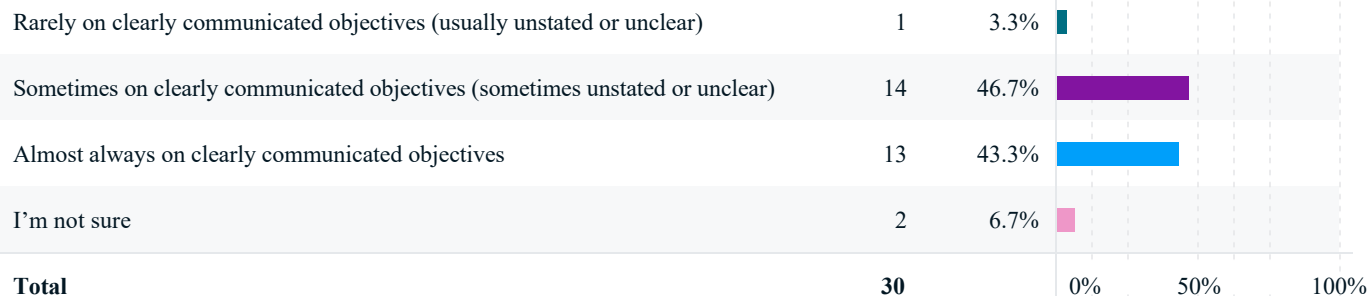

The objectives for learning were always clear in each section, and there was little up to interpretation.

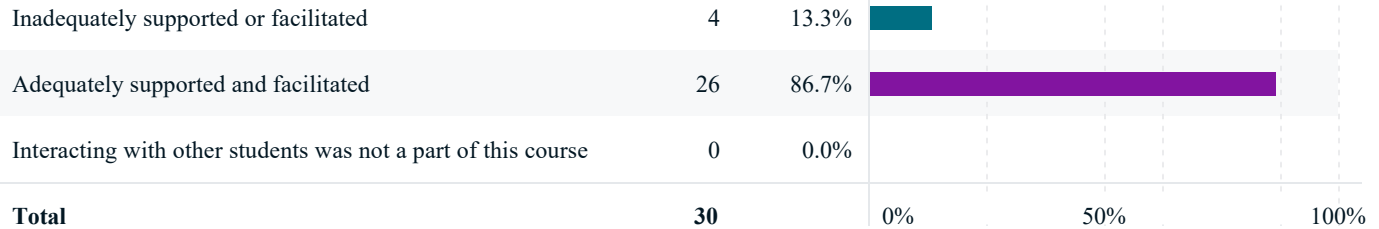

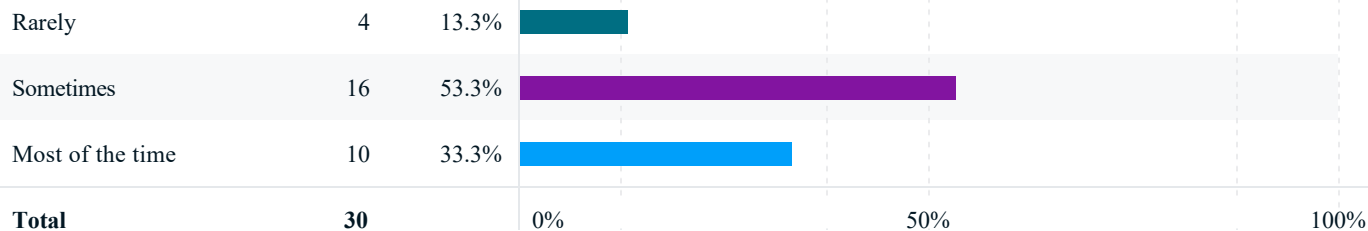

I just did whenever I knew the answer

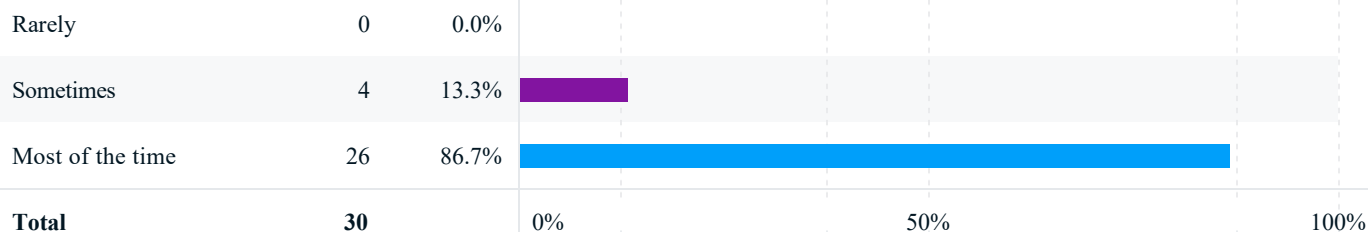

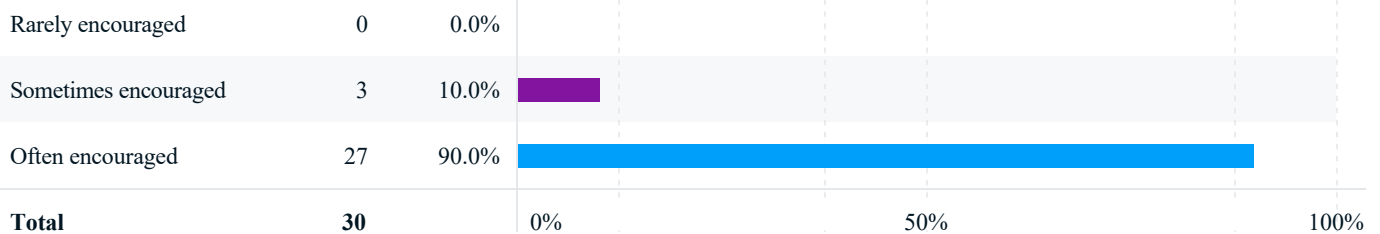



I also understand that striving for an A is sometimes unrealistic, however, what made this course tricky was its inconstancy. Collab 1 changed groups and form from Collab 2 and 3. Exam 1 was all online with notes, Exam 2 was in person with a note sheet, Exam 3 was half and half. The exam changes made it hard to understand what I needed to know for this class. I was constantly changing my study and note habits to accommodate to the next exam which was stressful and exhausting. It also would have been nice to go over more examples in class explained by the professor because when a student explains it, 9 times out of 10 they are just saying the answer and not explaining how it happened.
I understand our professor is very smart and wants to teach us. However, her methods were unsuccessful very repetitive and often hard to understand. Also, question and discussion or participation were daring and put down.
